Aims and expected results	<p>The students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Be encouraged to think about what matters to them. - Be able to express their agreement or disagreement 		
Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - List of statements - 4 signs which say: I agree, I disagree, I am not sure, I don't bother 		
Description of the activity:	Introduction	Mark 4 sides of the room with a different sign (agree, disagree, not sure and not bothered).	
	Main activity	<p>Ask the group to listen to the statements being read out (by the teacher) and move to the side of the room that reflects how they feel about it.</p> <p>Encourage discussion about the statements being read out and ask people to explain why they agree, disagree, are not sure or not bothered.</p>	
	Conclusion and Evaluation	At the end of the activity, make sure that everyone's voice is listened to.
